read alouds:

Last week we finished Follow My Leader, the story of an 11 year old boy who become blind after an accident with a firework. It chronicles how Jimmy acclimates to life without sight and gains independence by working with his seeing eye dog, Leader. It is also a story of forgiveness, as he is forced to reconcile with the other boy involved in the accident.

Our current read aloud is called <u>Because of Mr. Terupt</u>. It is the story of a motley group of fifth graders and their rookie teacher. It deals with some great themes including: what it feels like to be left out, that people grow and change and need to be forgiven, interactions with students with special needs.

Please note: There is a sequel to <u>Because of Mr. Terupt</u> that I *do not* recommend for third grade reading (often kids like the first book and want to read the sequel on their own). In the second book the class is in 6th grade and it deals with topics like changing bodies & peer pressure.
