# CURRICULUM THis week...

#### •ELA (ENCLISH LANCUACE ARTS) We are continuing with setting the structures and procedures of Daily 5 in place. This week we will add "Listening to Reading" and "Writing" blocks.

#### •Math

This week we will do a review of telling time including to the full hour, half hour, quarter hour, five minutes, and minute. We will also study elapsed time and rounding. Also, yes we are actually beginning Rocket Math (for real this time <sup>(2)</sup>). Please go here if you'd like to volunteer some time to our classroom to grade rocket math. In second grade the same set of parents did Rocket Math on a weekly basis. I have it set up a bit differently. Some students are even outfitting their houses with little circuits they made with batteries and light bulbs. It is so cool to see their knowledge in action!
